# From Sea to Shining Sea

To commemorate Patriot Day, Sept. 11, memorial services and candlelight vigils take place across the country in remembrance of the innocent victims of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Towers. U.S. flags fly at half-staff, and the country shares a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 a.m. (EDT).

Although the country mourns this loss, the spirit of the Twin Towers lives on. Steel from the towers has risen from the ashes and is now plunging through ocean waves as a U.S. Naval warship, defending American freedom. The Navy found the twisted steel to still be of significant strength, so parts of the Towers' remains were used in the new ship's bow stem. Though state names are typically reserved for naval submarines, New York Governor George E. Pataki asked that this special surface warship bear the name "New York" in honor of the victims, heroes and courageous New Yorkers who immortalized that day. His request was granted. This ship will be the fifth ship of the U.S. Navy to have the name New York. Ironically, the keel of a previous USS New York (BB-34) was laid on Sept. 11, 1911, exactly 90 years before the World Trade Center attack.
