

A Guide to Breast Cancer Awareness

October is National Breast
Cancer Awareness Month. Learn
more about this disease that is
the second leading cause of
cancer death among women.
Breast cancer typically begins in
milk ducts or glands, although it
can form in other breast tissues.
Male breast cancer is possible,
but rare.

The most common symptom is a new lump or mass felt in the breast. Other breast cancer symptoms include pain or swelling in all or part of the breast, including the nipple; irritation of the breast skin or nipple, such as redness, dimpling or thickening; nipple discharge, and a newly inverted nipple. These symptoms do not necessarily indicate breast cancer, but any changes to the breast should be checked out by your doctor. Mammograms can detect cancer before symptoms are present. The American Cancer Society recommends women have yearly mammograms beginning at age 40. The cause of breast cancer is unknown, but there are certain risk factors associated with the disease. Genetic risks include a family history of breast or ovarian cancer; dense breast tissue; never being pregnant; having children at a late age; early menstruation, and late menopause.
